West Yorkshire Youth Games 2010

The County High 5 Netball competition reached its climax at the 12th annual First Direct West Yorkshire Youth Games on Saturday 26th June.

Nearly 900 young athletes from 76 schools across the five districts competed in 10 sports with netball being one of them.

The next generation of the county's athletes gathered at Leeds Metropolitan University's Carnegie campus in one of the most exciting fixtures in the county's sporting calendar.

The biggest games to date got off to an active start with a grand opening parade and ceremony. Special guests were Leeds Carnegie Captain Jo Davies, and team mate Lisa Ferneyhough who inspired the youngsters with their opening ceremony speech as well as joining in the mass warm up led by UK Fitness Instructors.

Netball featured heavily in the games this year with Lisa and Jo on hand throughout to share their experiences and advice with the youngsters in all the sports. In addition, Hattie Grant, a pupil from The Grammar School at Leeds was asked to be part of the VIP party due to her selection into the Leeds Carnegie NTL squad at just 14 years old. She was interviewed by Director of West Yorkshire Sport Nigel Harrison in front of the VIPs about what it was like to be a performance athlete, and was taken on a tour with other guests around all the events taking place at the games.

The High 5 netball competition produced some exciting netball, with much talent and enthusiasm from the players who had come through their district finals to qualify for the county final.

The winners were St Joseph's Primary School from Wakefield (Pictured).

Well done must go to Frobelian (Leeds), St Joseph's, Keighley (Bradford), Scissett Middle (Kirklees) and Greenland (Calderdale) also for taking part.



High 5's all the way!!

Nearly 80 year 4 and year 5 pupils, travelled to The English Institute of Sport, in Attercliffe, Sheffield, on Wednesday July 7th to take part in what is now an annual High 5's Netball tournament. The day was coordinated by Liz Hughes, SSco at Silverdale and Jane Webster, SSco at King Edward VII School for their family of schools and so the day was a joint venture between two School Sports Partnerships of Points and The Arches who have linked with Sheffield Concord Netball Club to provide this opportunity. The event took on a different format this year, as coaches and players from Sheffield Concord treated the pupils to a morning of coaching before organising a tournament for them in the afternoon.

High Fives is the game recommended by England Netball for children of this age group where everyone has the opportunity to play lots of matches and experience different playing positions, but equally importantly, to have fun. The 10 teams that took part were divided into two leagues in the initial stages of the tournament and the results of the leagues were as follows.

Semi Finals were then played between Springfield 1 and 2 on one court and Nether Green 1 and Westways 1 on the other court. After two very close games, the teams qualifying for the final game were Springfield 1 (who won 2-1) and Westways 1, which meant that both of the partnerships were represented in the final. Again another exciting game followed with Springfield eventually coming out as the victors (1-0) in what was a very enjoyable, closely fought and competitive game. The spirit shown by all players throughout the day was tremendous and the pupils were a credit to themselves, their teachers and also their schools. Hopefully, these teams will now be inspired to play in next year's Partnership High Fives Festivals, aiming to qualify for the South Yorkshire round.

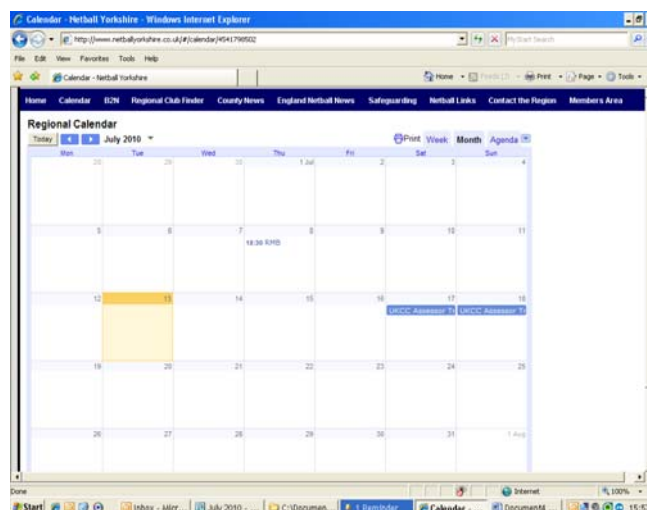

After successfully delivering three Recruit into Coaching Camps for 60 budding young coaches between the age of 16 - 25, England Netball is pleased to announce that it has secured funding to deliver another camp for 20 more coaches before the end of 2010.

The Recruit into Coaching Programme provides the opportunity for young people from 70 priority areas to receive the support and develop the skills and inspiration they need to step into coaching in their local communities. In return they will then assist in delivering netball for local young people.

What are the benefits to trainee coaches?

The programme will provide the following support to Recruit into Coaching Coaches:

- A five day residential course which will include:
- UKCC Level 1 Coaching Course and Assessment
- scUK Safeguarding Children Workshop
- Practical Coaching Experience
- Mentoring Support

- You must be able to demonstrate your commitment to coaching and articulate the aspirations you have as a coach
- You must live and coach in one of the 70 priority areas (see below for a list of the priority areas in Yorkshire)

Its that time again - the rules of netball- your chance to influence them

Is there a netball rule which drives you nuts or which you wish could be changed? This could be your chance to affect the way our great game is played, all around the world!

The last Official Netball Rules review was held in 2007, and instead of waiting for the normal eight years IFNA agreed that the next rules review will be in 2011, at an International Netball Federation Congress. In order to change the rules, all member countries must submit any proposed changes by **30th September 2010**, which will then all be voted on by the member countries.

From the proposals submitted, the IFNA Rules Advisory Panel will determine if there are any rules, identified in the review, which would benefit from a trial period, and will then determine all the processes of how that trial can be conducted. Once the trial has been completed successfully, the IFNA Rules Advisory Panel will then draw up draft recommendations for consideration by congress.

So if you have a ruling which you feel should be changed to benefit the game, then England Netball would like to hear from you. Any suggestions must be received at Head Office by **16th August 2010** so that they can be considered by the England Netball Rules Board before our submission to the IFNA Committee. Please look at the rules and suggest any changes - however, please remember that you need to provide a reason for your suggestion, alongside the wording for your new proposal.
